"Wherever you tread the land, I will give" (Josh.1:3, Deu.11:24)



1. Catching the vision.

a) A divine mandate.

- Where there is no vision... (Prov.29:18)
- Every person /believer must have a vision in his life.
- The vision must not be self-generated but imparted from God.
- Many say, I am seeing visions.....end up only as visionaries without any mission.
- Joshua's vision was a fulfilment of Abrahamic Covenant.
- So, what is your vision?

b) Joshu's vision was to inherit the land (Josh.1:2-4).

- Moses is dead, Arise, I am with you.
- God's promise is the foundation of Joshua's vision.
- Entire territory is promised.



- Today, we have a big territory to win 5:100 in India.
- God has given a vast land, the state of chhattisgarh, with 33 districts.
- Our God is giving the same promise, "I will be with you."
- Go ye therefore (Matt.28:18-20)....
- Proclaiming the Gospel is mandatory. It is given all four Gospels and Acts. (Matt.28:18-20; Mk.16:15; 13:10; Luke 24:47; John 20:21-22; Acts 1:8).
- God's presence is much more than what it was before (Joel 2:28). "I will pour out my Spirit....."
- God's presence is not just a distant power but an intimate, empowering force that guides, protects, and works through us according to His purpose.




- His presence is everywhere, wherever we go. Prophet Jonah felt God's presence deep inside the sea in a whale's belly.
- Do you want to obey like Joshua or want to run away like Jonah?
- God's work cannot be stopped.
- In the Gospel = Go + Spell is already given.

c) Converting Vision into Mission:

- Convinced 2½ tribes, i.e. Reubenites, Gadites and the half tribe of Manasseh, after defeating Amorites.
- Sent two spies to spy the land before their first battle with Jericho. Campus walk.
- Relied on God's will, despite the news that the people of Jericho were very much scared of the Israelites.
- Spiritual consecration (Josh.3:5).
- Crossing the Jordan when it was in flood.





Two heaps of stones

- 1. The pile at Gilgal (Josh. 4:3, 20) carried out of the river to set up at Gilgal was meant to teach the future generation that Israel could enter the Promised Land.
- Our God is a covenant-fulfilling God.
- It shows God's faithfulness.
- 2. The Pile of stones in the Jordan River (Josh.4:9).
- God stopped Jordan river so that Israel could pass through.
- Oh| Israel, your sins are covered. (Micah 7:15).
- Stop remembering your previous sinful life and start a new renewed life (2 Cor.5:17).



How did Joshua complete his Mission?

Joshua equipped himself

a) Spiritual equipping:

- Obedience and Meditation: Followed Moses in every aspect.
- Moses laid hands on Joshua (Deu.34:9). (Back to basics)
- A two-fold confirmation of God's choice (Josh 1:17).
- Relying on God's Word (The Law): The book of the Law shall not depart (Josh.1:8).
- Received the Spirit of Wisdom (Deu.34:9).
- Affirming the Covenant. Physical circumcision (Josh.5:5), symbolising putting to death the deeds of the flesh (Col.2:9-13)

- Setting up God's ark and stones at Gilgal. Do you have a strong EGF/Church base?
- What spiritual equipping is needed for you?

b) Joshua was commissioned by God.

- Be strong and courageous (Josh.1:6,7,9)
- He was obedient to God and Moses for 40-years (Ex.24:13).
- He had a great experience as a faithful spy (Num.14:6-9).
- He was a seasoned warrior (Ex.17:9-13).
- He had an encounter with the angel of God.
- God is commissioning you (2 Cor.5:20) We are ambassadors of Christ...



3. Engaging God-given resources.

- His success was not due to a superior military strategy but faithful engagement of supernatural resources.
- God's divine presence The Ark. Priests carried the Ark of the Covenant (3:14-17).
- Although Manna stopped, they ate the produce of the land (Josh.5:17).
- People listened to Joshua for supernatural victory (6:6-9)
- Joshua developed faith and patience among the people (6:10-14).



Victory over Jericho.


- They trusted the God of impossibilities.
- They obeyed him in every detail that God had given him.
- Rahab and her household were spared – a promise fulfilled.
- The curse on Jericho, God fulfilled (1 Ki.16:34).
- God blessed Rahab, Zacchaeus (Lk.19:1-10), Blind Bartimaeus (Mk.10:46-52), all from Jericho.



Joshua defeats 5-Kings. (10:12-14)

- Miracles on the battlefield. "Do not be afraid; I have given them into your hand. Not one of them will be able to withstand you. (Josh.10:8).
- Hail stones from Heaven: This killed more enemies than the sword.
- Sun Stands Still: "The sun stopped in the middle of the sky and delayed going down about a full day" (Josh.10:13)

Celestial intervention



- The defeat and victory of AI helped Joshua to cleanse the sin among the Israelites.
- The Gibeonite deception: Joshua defended Gibeonites despite their deceptive treaty. God honours covenant faithfulness.
- God fights for His people.
- Victory comes through obedience and prayer: Joshua's bold prayers and trust in God led to supernatural victory.
- Would you like to see such supernatural things?
- Radhakrishna said: Christians are ordinary people, but their claims are extraordinary.

4. Enlarging the Kingdom


"Every place that the sole of your foot shall tread upon, to you have I given it, as I said to Moses" (Josh.1:3).

"Every place where the sole of your foot treads shall be yours: from the wilderness and Lebanon, from the river, the River Euphrates, even to the Western Sea, shall be your territory" (Deu. 11:24).

Enlarging the Territory through Divine strength.

- Central and Southern Campaigns: After Jericho and Ai, Joshua led decisive campaigns, broke the power of major Canaanite alliances, conquering the heartland (Josh.8-10).
- The Lord gave Israel all the land he swore to their fathers. (Josh.21:43-45).

- Joshua divided the Land: He made a precise division of the conquered land by lots (Josh.14-22).
- He made the Cities of refuge (Josh.20).
- Finally, he made an emotional Farewell speech at the end of his life. Choose this day, whom you will serve;
 - "But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."



Strengths:

- Unwavering Faith: Joshua and Caleb (Num. 13:30; 14:6-9).
- Servant Leadership: Served Moses faithfully for 40-years (Ex.24:13).
- Absolute Obedience to God: Followed divine instructions.
- Spiritual Resolve: His farewell address Personal and Family commitment to God. (Josh.24:15).

Weakness:

 Failure to seek counsel – made treaty with Gibeonites (Josh.9:14).
